June's Speakers

David Menary

David Menary is the author of Terrier Town: Summer of '49 (WLU Press, 2003), which won an honourable mention award at the Foreword Magazine Book of the Year Awards in Chicago (2004). Menary's book lost out to Mark Twain, whose unfinished sequel to Huckleberry Finn was completed by Lee Nelson — Huck Finn and Tom Sawyer Among the Indians (Council Press, 2003). Menary's work has also been recognized with a Milt Dunnell Award (Ontario Community Newspaper Association), and by a Bernice Adams Award. Menary's second book, The River and the Railroad (Blue River Press, 2010), semiautobiographical in nature, chronicles the fictional adventures of two 13-year-old boys in the last year before the Great War.



The setting of New Thunder is based on the Galt area. A former newspaper journalist and teacher, his most recent works have mostly delved into local history and include the Cambridge Sports Hall of Fame book (2015), Great Trees of Canada (Blue River Press, 2013), Gordie Howe: A Year in Galt (Blue River Press, 2014), Brothers of the Wind (2014), Frederick Douglass in Galt (Blue River Press, 2014),


Lusitania: The Waterloo County Connection (Blue River Press, 2015), and the soon-to-be-published Of Rowing and the River: Grand River Stories. He is the founder of It Happened in Cambridge, and co-founder of the Cambridge Sports Hall of Fame. He has a masters degree in history.

Kathy Drew Smith

Kathy was born and raised in Galt, and has lived here all of her life. In fact, she has lived on the same street for 60 years. That is because she married the boy next door.... well almost.... there were two houses between them! They now live in Tom's family home which was bought by his parents in 1949. Kathy is best known for being co owner of Reid Chocolates along with her husband Tom Drew-Smith. In fact, her career began at the tender age of 22!

Now it is Tom and Kathy's children, Ted and Carrie, who are enjoying taking this sweet business to new heights. The Man from Malagash was written as a labour of love to honour her Mother's MacKenzie family and also to enrich the missing chapters of the history of Canada's Yukon and Eastern Arctic.

Chandra Moti was born and raised in South Africa and lived in Cambridge with her husband and 3 daughters since 1975. In 1972, after a visit to Canada, they decided to move to Canada because of segregation in South Africa at that time. In December of the year that they migrated to Canada, she gave birth to a daughter at the Cambridge Memorial Hospital. Unfortunately, her husband passed away in 2019, from cardiac arrest.

She has had a variety of jobs in Canada. She eventually got a job in banking, after taking a banking course at Conestoga College. Her daughters have successful careers. She is very proud of their accomplishments.


